E-DEVOTION FOR TUESDAY, JANUARY 12

As I sat down to write this devotional for this day, I was at a loss. I had no words. So, I did what I often do when I find myself in that state, I opened my Bible and there it was... Matthew 8:23-26:

"Jesus got into a boat, and his disciples went with him. Suddenly a fierce storm hit the lake, and the boat was in danger of sinking. Jesus was asleep... the disciples woke him saying, 'Save us Lord! We are about to die!' Jesus answered them, 'What little faith you have!' Then he got up and ordered the winds and the waves to stop, and there was great calm."

It feels like we are in the middle of a great storm. Many of us have faced fierce storms before in life. We just want to WAKE UP find the winds have died down and the waves are calm... smooth sailing.... straight ahead.

Give strength to those who serve... who work towards healing. We pray especially for our doctors, our nurses, our police, our firefighters, our leaders. Let the storms cease... calm these seas."
